
11/28-30—Cogat Testing



We will administer the Cognitive Abilities Tests (CogAT) to our kindergarten students on November 28-30, 2017. These standardized tests measure aptitudes in areas of verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning, and non-verbal reasoning.

CogAt scores are used for three primary purposes:

- to guide efforts to adapt instruction to the needs and abilities of students
- to provide a measure of each student's level of cognitive development that captures important information not represented in school grades or in other measures of school achievement
- to identify students whose predicted levels of achievement are markedly discrepant for their observed levels achievement.



Monday– Read poem in Poetry Journal Follow directions in the Monday box Read or be read to for 20 minutes. ABC activity letter Rr. Complete Week 6 of the Reading Train.

Tuesday– Read poem in Poetry Journal Follow directions in the Tuesday box. Read or be read to for 20 minutes. Math– count and compare.

Wednesday– Read poem in Poetry Journal Follow directions in the Wednesday box. “Read or be read to for 20 minutes. Read and Color

Thursday– Read poem in Poetry Journal Follow the directions in the Thursday box. Read or be read to for 20 minutes. Math Number 6.

Frost Elementary Uniform Dress Code Reminder

Description:

- **Bottoms:** Khaki, black or navy blue solid slacks, shorts, skirts or jumpers. Long blue denim jeans, or blue denim shorts, skorts or jumpers. All bottoms need to be of the appropriate length and fit as directed in the district dress code standards.
- **Tops:** Red, white, navy blue or light blue collared shirts may be worn. Frost Elementary spirit shirts, school shirts, turtlenecks or school sweatshirts may also be worn. Solid colored shirts or tops may not have any visible logos and all shirts must be tucked into the bottoms. Viewable undershirts should be one of the uniform shirt colors. Plain white T-shirts may also be worn under Uniform Dress shirts. Leggings and tights should be red, black, blue, white or khaki.

- **Jackets:** Solid red, navy blue, black, khaki or white jackets may be worn during class time.

Other: No backless shoes, flip flops, sweatpants, overalls, hats, caps, scarves, skate shoes or rolling backpacks are allowed.

Frost Elementary doors open at 7:00 a.m., the tardy bell rings at 7:30

TARDY POLICY



If students are late, a tardy pass will be issued. Being tardy not only prevents your child from receiving critical information, it also interrupts the learning process.

Students are considered tardy if they are not in the teacher's class by 7:30 a.m. Students with excessive tardiness will be referred to the attendance committee for consideration of ISS and a home visit by the social worker. Three or more tardies in a year will disqualify students from attendance awards.
