School Board calls for \$445.4 million bond election



Lamar CISD is one of the fastest growing school districts in Texas. Over the last decade the District has added over 10,000 students—with another 11,000 to 23,000 projected to arrive over the next 10 years. Lamar CISD currently uses 152 portable classrooms around the District to address the increasing number of students.

What's in the Bond 2017 proposal?*

- New Schools & Land - \$316.7 million
- Technology - \$34.3 million
- Interior Improvements - \$29.1 million
- Athletics - \$24.4 million
- Fine Arts - \$18.3 million
- Exterior Improvements - \$11.4 million
- Transportation - \$7.9 million
- Food Service Upgrades - \$3.3 million

**Projected expenditures based on current conditions*


Over 70 percent of Bond 2017 is for new schools and land. This includes High School #6, Junior High School #6 and three new elementary schools. The rest is to help maintain equity at our existing campuses. You can see a detailed list of every item in the bond by visiting www.lcisid.org.

40,000 houses on the horizon

Lamar CISD is projected to add over 40,000 new single-family homes and over 10,000 multi-family homes over the next decade—with an additional 1,000+ students projected each year. This will almost double the amount of housing options currently in the District. Out of the 61 Greater Houston school districts, Lamar CISD ranked in the top three for most housing starts in 2016. In the past year alone, Lamar CISD added eight new neighborhoods.

Citizens' Bond Committee

A 61-member Citizens' Bond Advisory Committee, composed of community members from across the District, met in April and May to study enrollment growth and demographic trends, and to review facility, transportation and technology needs. In June, the committee recommended the School Board call a bond election.

Bond 2017 will impact the average homeowner by approximately \$8.18 a month

The average home in Lamar CISD, with a taxable value of \$231,000, would potentially see an estimated tax increase of approximately \$8.18 a month or \$98 a year after all bonds have been issued. However, senior citizens whose property taxes are frozen would not be impacted.

If property value growth exceeds 9%, the tax impact could be significantly less.

We have been very lucky so far this year as dismissal weather is concerned. I wanted to clarify a few things for the future in case Severe Weather has to be called at any point during the school year.

Rain in and of itself does not constitute severe weather. The radar is watched very closely by the administration team at Lindsey as our student safety is our number one priority. Severe weather will be called at 2:20p.m. Once severe weather is called an email will be sent out through the skyward system notifying all parents that if their children are walkers and bikers they will be sent home using their designated severe weather mode of transportation. All car riders and bus riders will go home their normal way. We do live in Texas and unfortunately the weather has a way of changing very quickly. Once we call severe weather no matter what it does outside we will still send the students home using the designated severe weather mode of transportation. If you have any questions please call and ask now so that we can clarify prior to severe weather being called.
