



Lamar CISD Secondary Parents,

The Learning Model Change Form for secondary students for the <u>fourth six weeks</u> is available in Skyward Family Access. The deadline for requesting a change in learning model for the fourth six weeks is Friday, Dec. 4. No changes in learning model will be accepted after Dec. 4, as the District must plan for master schedules, classroom space, virtual instruction and how to best meet the needs of our students.

Parents who would like to change their student's learning model can use <u>these instructions</u> to access and submit the form in Skyward. <u>If there is no change for your student, you do not need</u> to submit the form. It is also important to note:

- It is our intent to minimize classroom shifts as much as possible, however, the need to balance class sizes and schedules with two different instructional models will likely require some students to have a different teacher for the fourth grading period, even if they haven't changed learning models.
- Campuses will contact families with students transitioning from virtual to on-campus instruction to communicate safety protocols and ensure a safe return to campus.
- All campuses will contact parents about next steps after the Dec. 4 deadline.

Overview of On-Campus Instruction:

- All parents are expected to screen students for COVID-19 symptoms each day prior to sending them to school.
- While the COVID-19 Risk Level is red, orange or yellow, face coverings are required for all students when in common spaces, hallways, on buses and during arrival and dismissal.

 Students in grades 4th-12th are also required to wear face coverings in the classroom.
- While in the classroom, students will be socially distanced as much as instructionally possible.

Overview of Virtual Instruction:

- Virtual instruction will require students to participate in asynchronous (online without realtime interaction) and synchronous (real-time) online learning.
- Each day, students will engage in daily lessons, activities and assignments in all classes to be marked present.
- Each virtual student will likely need their own device and access to high-speed internet at home.

LEAMAN JUNIOR HIGH FINAL EXAM EXEMPTION PROCEDURES Fall 2020

1. District Exemption Policy:

- An 80 or above in class to be exempted (average 1st, 2nd, & 3rd six weeks).
- No more than 3 office referrals, with no more than 1 assignment to ISS not to exceed 3 days. No assignments to ALC or suspensions. (Refer to discipline box on exemption form).
- No outstanding fees/fines (Do not grant an exemption until student obtains administrator signature and library signature. This ensures student is clear of holds and fines).
- Reductions in grade below 80, fine, or discipline referral after the exemption declaration may negate the exemptions.

2. Questions?

Students who have a question or need assistance during the exemption process may go to their grade level administrator's office. If we are unable to immediately answer your question – we will resolve your question/concern within 24 hours.

3. Where do I go if I exempt a final but need to remain on campus?

Students who exempt a final exam but require transportation to or from campus and are therefore on campus during the exempted time period must immediately report to their classroom. A pass will be handed to exempt students to go to the cafeteria for monitoring.

4. When do I receive my Fall 2020 Exemption Form?

The Final Exam Exemption process will open in Skyward on Friday, Dec. 4th. See the attached instructions on how to select which classes the student will exempt.

5. When & Where do I turn in my Exemption Form?

All students, face-to-face and virtual, must have their Final Exam Exemptions completed in Skyward by Wednesday, Dec. 9th. Forms will not be accepted after the deadline. No exceptions.

6. Holds/Fines/Fees/Textbooks & Equipment

Students who have a hold, fine, fee, textbook or equipment fee must clear their fine by Friday, Dec. 11th @ 9:00 AM to avoid losing their exemption. This includes all technology that was checked out to virtual students who have returned. Current virtual students do not need to turn in their checked out technology.

7. Can I exempt ELA, Math, Science or Social Studies both semesters?

Students may exempt a core final exam during Fall and Spring as long as junior high exemption requirements are met (see above).

8. Can I exempt my elective or extra-curricular class (athletics, CTE, fine arts)?

Yes, students may exempt their elective or extra-curricular class if the exemption requirements have been met, the coach/director approves the exemption and the exemption counts toward the student exemption limit.

9. Final Exam Make-up Dates & Information (must be pre-arranged with approval).


Final exam make-up dates begin on Tuesday, January 5th (8:00 AM – 4:00 PM) and run through Friday, January 8th (8:00 AM – 4:00 PM). Students who have excused absences due to extenuating circumstances and notify teachers prior to the absence are eligible for the make-up exam dates in January. Failure to show for a final exam without prior approval from Mr. Semmler (Principal) will result in a 0 for the final exam grade. Make-up exams will be held with the classroom teacher.

10. May I take a final exam prior to the first final exam administration on Wednesday, Dec. 16th?

If a Teacher can work it out to take the exam in advance, this is fine, but due to test security and fairness, you may be required to attend the Final Exam makeup sessions January $5^{th} - 8^{th}$. (see above).




For Parents/Caregivers of children/adolescents: We offer NAMI Basics a 6-week class to parents understand what the condition presents for the family, how to manage extended family relationships, best practices in caring for the child, communication with the medical community and school. It also includes information related to treatment, self-care and advocacy. Each session is 2 ½ hours.

The NAMI Peer-to-Peer Education Course is for individuals living with a mental health condition (18 years and older) who is interested in establishing and maintaining their wellness and recovery. Each class is two hours in length and continues for 8 consecutive weeks.

NAMI Courses use a combination of lecture, interactive exercise and structured group processes, and the diversity of experience among the course participants affords for a lively dynamic that moves the courses along.
