9th grade:

- Focus on your grade point average – a strong start is important
 - Ranking will not be available until February of 10th grade year
- Take PAP classes available
- Take 1 AP class

10th grade:

- Focus on your grade point average – you still have time to improve
- Take PAP classes available
- Take 2 AP classes
- Start preparing for PSAT/SAT/ACT

11th grade:

- Major increase in grade point average is not likely
- Take PAP classes available
- Take 3-4 AP classes
 - English III AP – rhetorical analysis tested on SAT essay
- Focus on PSAT/SAT/ACT preparation
 - PSAT: Fall – National Merit Scholarship Program (99.5%) and National Hispanic Recognition Program
 - SAT: Spring – school day
- Admissions GPA requirements based off transcripts for 11th grade year

12th grade:

- Take 2-3 AP classes to help improve final ranking
- Increase in ranking or SAT/ACT not possible for **early decision** applications
- Raising your SAT/ACT scores is your best bet for getting accepted into college despite a GPA that's on the lower side.
 - SAT as late as January and the ACT as late as February for **regular decision** applications for some colleges. Deadlines vary by college.
