

George Ranch High School - National Honor Society

The George Ranch High School Chapter of the National Honor Society is a group of students selected on their service, scholarship, leadership, and character. Members are required to maintain a 104 (weighted) average or more and devote at least 8 service hours to the community, 4 service hours to the school, and 8 additional hours to organizations of choice per semester.

Applications to join NHS are delivered to qualifying GRHS students at the end of the fall semester for eligible juniors and seniors. Once applications are reviewed and scored, selected students are invited to join NHS. The induction ceremony occurs annually in late January.

Through NHS, students are able to earn their academic letter jacket. Students receive the basic letter jacket with the GR on the front, after being inducted into the National Honor Society. If students have already earned the jacket, they can request an insert (small torch that they can sew onto their GR), and if desired can purchase an NHS patch. Students are responsible for the cost of any patches. If the student is currently getting a jacket through another organization the insert will be put on along with the other organization's insert.

The George Ranch chapter of the National Honor Society requires students to excel in academics, participate in the school and community, and be an active leader in society. The NHS develops students to be ready for the real world by having them work in the community to build character and foster prosperity. Frequently Asked Questions

What is the National Honor Society?

The George Ranch High School Chapter of the National Honor Society is a group of students selected on their service, scholarship, leadership, and character. Students are required to achieve and maintain a 104* average or more and devote at least 8 service hours to the community, 4 service hours to the school, and 8 additional hours to organizations of choice per semester.

Why should my child join NHS?

The George Ranch chapter of the National Honor Society requires its members to excel in academics, participate in the school and community, and be an active leader in society. The NHS develops students to be ready for the real world by having them work in the community to build character and foster prosperity.

How does my child get into NHS?

Any student who meets the requirements for scholarship (maintains a cumulative weighted GPA of 104* or above) will be eligible to apply to the National Honor Society. The student should then receive an application at the end of the fall semester of junior or senior year of high school, and if selected, will later be inducted into the organization. In order to be selected, a student must demonstrate good character, leadership, and a desire to render service to their school and community.

Can I get a Letterman through NHS?

Yes. Students can receive their academic letter jacket after being inducted into the National Honor Society.

What is the GRHS NHS Senior Scholarship?

The GRHS NHS senior scholarship is a monetary award to be used at the recipient's college of choice. The scholarship is given to a handful of NHS members who have demonstrated a profound devotion to service, a unique portrayal of character & leadership, and a high regard for academic excellence. The scholarship application is available to all NHS members in good standing and is made available mid-March and due at the end of April each year. Money raised through NHS member fundraising and NHS sponsored events, such as the GRHS Winter Carnival, are the primary sources for funding the scholarships.

When are the meetings?
