## NOTES FROM THE NURSE . . .

**If your child is sick:** Children must be free of fever (**less than 100.0 degrees**) for 24 hours **without** the use of fever reducing medications (such as Tylenol or Advil / Motrin) before returning to school. Children must be free of diarrhea/vomiting and tolerating food and water for 24 hours before returning to school. Please call the school nurse if your child has been diagnosed with a contagious condition such as pink eye, strep throat, chicken pox, head lice, impetigo, ringworm, flu or has vomiting and/or diarrhea.

**Medications:** Children are **not** permitted to carry medications including cough drops. Over the counter medications for less than 6 weeks must be accompanied by an LCISD form from the parent authorizing administration of the medication, reason and dose, time and amount. **Parents** must deliver the medication, **in its original container**, to the clinic and bring only the necessary amount for school. All prescription medications must be in the **original pharmacy container** with the child's name, medication date and dosing instructions. Medications such as antibiotics for 3 times a day or every 8 hours are to be given at home. Just follow a before breakfast, after school and before bedtime schedule.

**\*There are no "stock medications" in the clinic such as Tylenol, Motrin, Tums, Neosporin, etc.**

**Food Allergies:** Food allergies can be life threatening. We are **NOT** a peanut free school, but do have a peanut free lunch area in the cafeteria and do not serve peanut items on the menu. In order to accommodate any food restrictions, you must fill out the Dietary Accommodation Form and have it signed by your physician. This can be found on the LCISD website under Business Office (Food Services) and click on the Dietary Accommodation section. Any other severe food allergies require a Life Threatening Allergy Action Plan signed by your physician.

**Immunizations:** Texas Department of Health requires all school age children to be up to date on immunizations. Children are excluded from school until the required immunizations are obtained and a copy is given to the school nurse. You may also reference <https://www.dshs.texas.gov/immunize/school/school-requirements.aspx> for a complete list of required immunizations **PRIOR** to starting school. Contact your school nurse with questions as needed.

**Clothing:** ALL kindergarteners should have a change of clothing in their backpacks. This is to avoid the nurse having to call you, should your child need a change of clothes for a restroom accident or any other reason.

**Absent:** If your child is absent, please send in a note from the doctor (if one was seen) or yourself stating the date and reason why your child was absent. There is an Attendance Review Committee that monitors the amount of tardy and absent days a student has and these notes are very important in order to avoid truancy charges.

## Lamar CISD Food Service- Free/Reduced On-line Meals Application 2018-2019

The Food Service Department will be accepting on-line applications for 2018-2019 Free/Reduced Meals Program. Parents/Guardian can begin applying on-line at [www.schoolcafe.com](http://www.schoolcafe.com) beginning the second week of August 2018.

Students attending the following schools **DO NOT** need to submit an on-line application for 2018-2019: Beasley, Bowie, Jackson, Jane Long, Meyer, Pink, Seguin, Smith, Taylor Ray and Travis. All students on these campuses are eligible for free breakfast and free lunch.

**NOTE: OTHER CAMPUSES MAY BE ADDED PRIOR TO JUNE 30, 2018.**

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**HOUSEHOLDS MUST FILL OUT AN ON-LINE APPLICATION FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS NOT LISTED ABOVE, AND FOR ALL MIDDLE, JR HIGH AND HIGH SCHOOLS (6<sup>TH</sup> THRU 12<sup>TH</sup>) TO DETERMINE IF YOUR CHILD QUALIFIES FOR FREE OR REDUCED-PRICE SCHOOL MEALS.**
