

### SMART TAG

#### Important info for BUS RIDERS

For the 21-22 school year, all students must have a Smart Tag to ride the bus. Parents should register at [www.parent.smart-tag.net](http://www.parent.smart-tag.net) to access the account and receive notifications/alerts from LCISD Transportation, along with many other features.

**\*NEW\* ALL Pre-K and Kindergarten students are REQUIRED** to have a Smart Tag account that lists authorized guardians who are allowed to pick up the student(s) from the bus stop.



Dear Parents,

The SMART tag system helps increase safety and security for students riding on a school bus, leveraging technology to improve student management and communications on school buses.

SMART tag monitors student loading and unloading, providing real-time information to the Transportation Department, and you, the parent.

**SMART tag will help...**

- increase driver, school, and parent awareness
- ensure riders will load on the right bus and unload at the right stop
- maximize rider safety and security
- enable drivers to efficiently and effectively carry out their duties
- ensure Special Education and Pre-K students are released to authorized guardians.\*

**SMART tag Parent Portal**

- SMART Alerts – sign up for SMART Alerts and receive emails or text messages when your child is approximately 10-15 minutes from their stop.
- SMART Locate – allows parents to view a map showing the bus as their child is being transported.
- Authorized guardian release feature. This tool allows parents to update authorized guardians through the Parent Portal.\*

Go to [parent.smart-tag.net](http://parent.smart-tag.net) and register to take advantage of the SMART tag Parent Features. If you are using a smart phone, you will be prompted to save the web app to your home screen. This will place the Parent App tile on your mobile device for easy access.

**How it Works**



**Student ID**

Students are issued a Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) SMART tag ID. RFID technology is a newer technology that is replacing bar codes in many industries such as medical (patient, equipment & supplies tracking), libraries (book tracking), and even amusement park access (Disney World now uses RFID wristbands). These IDs communicate with the driver tablets. No student info is stored on the tag.

**Bus Tablet**

SMART tag school buses are equipped with a tablet computer and RFID reader. When loading and unloading a bus, riders present their ID onto the reader. The tablet will display if the rider is boarding the correct bus, and if they are getting off at their correct stop.



**Transportation Administration**

When bus activity begins, rider info is immediately available for the transportation administrators, so they can oversee all school bus activity.

**Parent App**

An online Parent Portal may be accessed at [parent.smart-tag.net](http://parent.smart-tag.net). On your iOS or Android smartphone you can save as web app to your home screen for easy access.



To add this web app to the home screen: tap and then Add to Home Screen.

## Cómo Funciona

### Identificación del Estudiante

A los estudiantes se les entregara una tarjeta de radio frecuencia (RFID) SMART tag ID. La tecnología RFID es una tecnología más moderna que esta reemplazado códigos de barras en muchas industrias como la industria médica (el seguimiento de pacientes y instrumentos), bibliotecas (seguimiento de libros), y tambien acceso a parques de atracciones (Disney World usa pulseras de RFID). Estas identificaciones se comunican con la tablet del conductor. Ninguna información del estudiante son guardan en las tarjetas de identificación.



### Tableta del Conductor

Los autobuses de SMART tag están equipados con una tableta de computadora. Cuando los estudiantes suben y bajan de los autobuses, ellos tocan el lector de RFID con su identificación. La tableta mostrara el perfil del estudiante informando al conductor si el estudiante está abordando el autobús correcto, tambien si el estudiante está tratando de bajarse en la parada equivocada.



### Administración de Transporte

Cuando la actividad del autobús escolar comienza, la información del estudiante esta inmediatamente disponible para los administradores del transporte, para que ellos pueden supervisar cualquier actividad del autobús escolar.

## PARENT DIRECTIONS – CAR RIDERS

Each family will be issued two car rider tags with your family's assigned car rider number for the 2021-2022 school year. Car rider tags are being issued to all families at Travis Elementary. For families with siblings, car rider tags will be issued to the oldest child attending Travis. Although your child may ride the bus, walk, or ride the day care bus home on most days, there may be times when you need to change their mode of transportation to car. We are asking all parents to place their car rider tags in their cars for such times. When you pull into the front drive, please make sure your car rider tag is placed on your front dashboard, so teachers can clearly read the number. If you are carpooling, you MUST have the car tags displayed for every student that you are picking up.

#### Please note:

- If you need to change your child's transportation, please send a signed letter to the teacher or call the front office before 2 PM.

Please place your car rider tag on your front dashboard with the number facing out. You will pull up to the first available cone to pick up your child. The teacher will match the car rider number on your car tag to the number on the child's backpack. If you are carpooling you must have the tags of all the students you are picking up. We will not release any students without an official Travis car rider tag. If you do not have the car rider tag you will need to park and come into the building to check your child out in person with a valid ID. We will only be able to assist you AFTER the car rider line is empty. For safety reasons, we are not able to buckle safety restraints. Please do not attempt to pass another car while in the car rider line. Stay in a single file line until you exit the driveway and refrain from passing any vehicles.

## 2021-22 COVID PROTOCOLS – RELEASED AUGUST 7, 2021

As we prepare for the 2021-2022 school year, Lamar CISD looks forward to welcoming our students back to campus.

The District is committed to creating a safe learning environment for our students and staff, and we continue to work in partnership with local and state health officials to monitor the spread of COVID-19 in the community.

To ensure safe in-person learning experiences, the following COVID-19 protocols will be in place in District facilities for the 2021-2022 school year:

- Face coverings in schools are optional. Parents are best equipped to decide whether or not their child should wear a mask.
- Parents/guardians are expected to screen their students for COVID-19 symptoms each day and staff will be required to self-screen before reporting to work.
- The District will continue to disinfect facilities and high-touch areas on a daily basis.
- Plexiglass dividers will be available upon request from the parent. Information regarding feedback from teachers about the cleanliness, durability and spacing will be shared with the parents at the time of the request, for full disclosure.
- If the County's COVID-19 Risk Level is at Red, all District campuses will screen visitors during the school day and campuses will utilize virtual meetings and electronic communication options when necessary.
- Any individuals with a lab-confirmed COVID-19 positive test may return to school or work when the following criteria are met: If symptomatic, at least 10 days have passed since symptom onset, and fever free, and other symptoms have improved. Individuals who test positive for COVID-19 but do not have any symptoms must stay home until at least 10 days after the day they were tested.

The District is currently researching virtual learning options for a limited number of students for the 2021-2022 school year and will provide more information soon. This option would be provided for families concerned with sending their students to school due to COVID-19 fears. The District will continue to serve our immunocompromised students separately on a case-by-case basis through homebound services.


As always, we thank you for your continued flexibility and support as we work to keep the Lamar CISD community safe.

## **NO COST MEALS FOR STUDENTS DURING SCHOOL YEAR 21-22**

Lamar CISD has announced its participation in the Seamless Summer Option for the 2021-2022 school year, offering healthy meals every school day to all students at no cost. Typically, a student's household must meet income eligibility requirements to qualify for free or reduced-price meals. However, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) issued guidance that allows schools to offer meals to all students at no cost for the 2021-2022 school year.

While no application or eligibility determination is required for our students to receive free meals this school year, income eligibility requirements will likely resume in the 2022-2023 school year.

## STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

The plans are designed to help offset deductibles and co-insurance. They are affordable limited-benefit plans that are renewable annually. There are several options for you to choose from:

- The **At-School Accident** Plan covers accidents occurring at school, during school hours. (Excludes participation in High School Varsity Football activities). At-School coverage may be purchased with or without sports.

- The **24-Hour Accident** Plan covers accidents anywhere, around the clock. (Excludes participation in High School Varsity Football activities). 24-Hour coverage may be purchased with or without sports.

- The **Football Accident** Plan covers only High School Varsity Football accidents that occur during practice or during a game. The Plan has a \$250 deductible.

- Acupuncture
  - Air travel except while as a fare-paying passenger on a regularly scheduled commercial air carrier, travel in or upon, sitting in or upon, alighting to or from, or working on or around any motorcycle or recreational vehicle including, but not limited to, two or three-wheeled motor vehicle, four-wheeled all terrain vehicle (ATV), jet ski, ski cycle, snowmobile or off-road motorized vehicle not requiring licensing as a motor vehicle.
  - Artificial aids such as eyeglasses, contact lenses, hearing aids, or examinations or prescriptions therefore unless specifically provided for in the Schedule of Benefits.
  - Cosmetic surgery of any kind, except reconstructive surgery as a direct result of a covered injury.
  - Dental treatment, except for accidental injury to Sound, Natural Teeth.
  - Elective Surgery or Elective Treatment.

  - Chronic or degenerative conditions, treatment for osteochondritis due to overuse and occurring during periods of rapid growth, including but not limited to Osgood-Schlatter Disease, osteochondritis dissecans, osteomyelitis, spondylolysis, slipped femoral capital epiphysis, and injuries from overuse, torsion, tendinitis, muscle tears, repetitive motion injuries, shin splints, sprains, strains, tennis elbow aggravation, neuritis, lumbago, and stress fractures unless specifically provided for in the Schedule of Benefits.
  - Immunizations, preventive medicines or vaccines, except where required for treatment of a covered injury.
  - Intoxicants and narcotics. The Company is not liable for any loss sustained or contracted in consequence of the Insured being intoxicated or under the influence of any narcotic unless the narcotic is administered on the advice of a Doctor.
  - Injury for which benefits are paid or payable by workers' compensation or employer's liability or occupational disease law.
  - Injury where the Insured is the operator of a motor vehicle and does not possess a current and valid motor vehicle operator's license (except in a Driver's Education Program).
  - Injury where the Insured is riding in or driving any type of motor vehicle as part of a speed contest or scheduled race, including testing such vehicle on a track, speedway, or proving ground.
  - War, declared or undeclared (a pro-rata premium will be refunded upon request for such period not covered); participation in a riot or civil disorder; or while a member of the Armed Services.
  - Orthodontics (braces) for any reason, damage to, or loss of orthodontics.
  - Orthopedic appliances used to protect an injury to allow an Insured to participate in athletic activities.
  - Play or practice of intercollegiate, High School Football, except where the coverage is elected.
  - Participating in or attending any School-Sponsored overnight activities, except where 24-Hour coverage is elected.
  - Pre-existing Conditions or aggravations of a Pre-existing Condition, as defined. A Pre-existing Condition is a disease or physical condition for which the Insured received medical advice or treatment during the six months before the Insured's Effective Date of Coverage.
  - Stroke or cardiovascular accident or event; cardiovascular accident or event; myocardial infarction or heart attack; coronary thrombosis; aneurysm.
  - Skiing, snow driving, surfing, roller skating, ice skating, or riding in a rodeo.
  - Skydiving, parachuting, hang gliding, glider flying, flight in an ultra light aircraft, parasailing, sail planing, bungee jumping, bob-sledding, or ballooning.
  - Suicide or attempt thereof, while sane or insane (including drug overdose); intentionally self-inflicted injuries; fighting.
  - Supplies, except as specifically provided in the Policy.
  - While committing or attempting to commit an assault or felony, or to which a contributory cause was the Insured being engaged in an illegal occupation.
  - Participation in terrorism.

## TOP 3 SKYWARD FAMILY ACCESS QUESTIONS


**Q: "I'm logged in and don't see the Online Forms button. What have I done wrong?"**

A: A few things could be the cause of this. Things to check are:

1. Is the parent logging in via an internet browser, not via the app? This functionality is only available through a browser.
2. Is the parent logging in as themselves – i.e. not as their student? Only guardians can fill out the form.
3. Is the parent a member of Family 1 in Skyward? Only Family 1 guardians can fill out the form.

**Q: The parent says they are logged in as themselves and they are a guardian in Family 1 – they cannot see the Online Forms button. What do we do?**

A: Please verify they are REALLY logged in as their guardian self. Here is the [canary](#) to check for: If you are logged in as a guardian, you will see "Family Access" above the student name in the top right corner. If you are logged in as the student, you will see "Student Access" above the student name in the top right corner. If they really are logged in as themselves and still cannot see the Online Forms button, submit a Skyward support ticket.



**Q: The parent has forgotten their username or password. How can they get that?**

A: Point them to <https://www.lcisd.org/students-parents/family-access> and have them click on the "Forgot Username/Password" button. They will then enter the email address we have in Skyward and the UN/PW reset link will be emailed directly to them.
